### Grace: To be able to form individuals to become men and women for and with others

It is said about a Superior General that was given several reports of some men who wished to enter the Society of Jesus by professing their final vows. After close consideration, prayer, and discernment, the General gave all the reports back with an approval except one. His assistants and counsellors did not ask him about it. One day they saw him in the corridor with the report of this person between his hands. He stopped near one of his assistants whom he trusted had good judgement and asked him: "Do you see this person leading the Society of Jesus?".
